-A strong relationship with your editor is important to the success of the novel 6. Try not to stress over first-draft. -Let the creative juices flow. -Worry about the story, not the grammar 7. Look for surprises in second-draft. -Find key ideas or motifs that reoccur in the story & try to incorporate it in more of the book 8. Start with strong character backstories. -It is important to create captivating characters that the reader will be interested in 9. -Reading other books is the best way to develop your writing style -Those authors are like invisible mentors -Think about what in the story motivates you & write it down
